Examination Results and Start of Term Arrangements

AS/Mock/Btec/Resits Results

I hope your examinations went well and you are looking forward to a successful Year 13.

Results will be issued along with the A level results on **Thursday 18th August from 9:00am-11:00am**. GCSE re-take results will be available on 25th August from 10:00am. You must collect your results from a member of staff and discuss your actions for next year. If you wish somebody else to collect your results we must have written consent prior to results day - we are unable to release results to any third party without prior consent.

Those who have achieved a 'U' in a particular subject will not be permitted to progress to Year 13 in that subject. **Please note you must achieve an A-E grade or at least a Pass at Btec in 3 or more subjects in order to continue into Year 13.** If you wish to resit any modules at the end of Year 13 you must agree this with your Subject Leader on returning to school in September.

Finishing Studies at after Year 12?

If you have decided you will be ceasing your studies after Year 12 then you must see Mrs Pritchard on results day to complete an official 'off register' form and return it signed to your Head of Sixth Form (references will not be released until all paperwork has been completed).

Arrangements for the start of term

The new school term commences on **Wednesday 7th September**. You will be required to go to the Sixth Form Common Room at **11:30am**. Lessons will commence on the afternoon of Wednesday 7th September.

Dress Code

Uniform for Sixth Form

Both the school and governors hold our Sixth Form students in high esteem; they are our role models for the younger pupils in the school. Their contribution to our academic environment is vital and as such their positive attitude to learning is paramount.

In order to maintain an appropriate dress code whilst allowing our Sixth Form students the privilege of wearing their individual choice of suit, and access to a modern working wardrobe, the school **reserves the right to send home** any student who fails to meet our standards.

It is suggested that students studying Art or Design courses wear an overall or apron in order to protect their clothing. **Students who do Sport and Performing Arts may wear appropriate clothing for that lesson only and must ensure a change of clothes is worn in all other lessons.**

Example:

- Smart suit – either matching jacket and skirt/dress OR matching jacket and trousers
- Top or blouse
- Collared work shirt
- Tie
- Smart / work shoes no 'Ugg' boots/similar
- Smart boots may be worn with trousers
- A business-like approach is expected with regards to hair colour and piercings

In order to maintain a business like appearance, there will be certain restrictions on the style of your suit.

- **Suit jackets** must be worn as outer jacket before a coat is introduced
- **Trousers** must be **full length and tailored style**, **no leggings, cropped, skinny, shiny, ripped trousers or shorts allowed**, **plain material – no denim allowed**
- **Skirts or dresses** must be of a **modest length** and **allow freedom of movement** around school.
- **Tops** must be of a suitable, **non see-through** material with a **modesty of neckline**. Length must ensure **complete covering of midriff**.
- **Footwear** must be suitable to maintain work appearance. **No trainers**
