

Places on the programme are limited and competitive. Your child's place will be reviewed at intervals to ensure they are still meeting the expectations for the programme.


The programme will include a variety of sessions centred around aiming high and supporting the students to reach their potential. For example, university talks/visits, careers sessions, debating, lateral thinking and development of skills needed to prepare students for their GCSEs, Sixth Form, the rigours of university and beyond. Please congratulate your child on this achievement, but also support them to ensure they continue to work hard. For example, this should include completing home learning on time and revising thoroughly for tests, etc. It is also important they continue to read complex and challenging texts at home and if possible, start to read around their favourite subjects to develop a passion for learning.

It is also important to have a balance, therefore extra-curricular clubs, hobbies and getting involved with student leadership roles are also important. These can often give students an all-round skill set and teaches them how to manage their time and be organised, all of which are essential skills that will help them to be successful and play an important part in future applications to university.
