Why we have chosen this curriculum...	Allows students to draw up on existing knowledge that they have of Christian traditions but also explore other non-Christian traditions and the importance/significance of these. They can further understand religious beliefs and their impact on society by studying the relationship between social change and social stability, and religious beliefs, practices and organisations. Explore and analyse the importance of cults, sects and New Age movements to religious and spiritual beliefs, and the impacts that these have on society as a collective.		Allows students to explore the types of crimes and patterns of crime in the UK, giving them a deeper understanding of the issues of it like unreported and unrecorded crime. They understand the causes of crime, building on theory that is consistently applied to different topics, and are able to compare these to one another. Along with, linking crime to other topics like families and households and education. This topic also builds on skills and content used at GCSE when covering this topic.
